Reading is one of the most important skills that we learn and develop. It is important that all children read regularly, preferably every evening, and that reading records are completed and signed every evening. Please encourage your son/daughter to read in order to develop their skill level and a love of reading.

REMINDERS



During the course of the term we accumulate a lot of lost property. Please make sure that all clothing and P.E./swimming kit is clearly labelled. PE kit should be left in school, tidily in the cloakroom.

HEALTHY LUNCHBOXES



We have a number of children who have severe allergies. It is important that NO products containing nuts are brought into school. Lunchboxes should contain a healthy variety of snacks and a non-fizzy, low sugar, drink. Sweets and chocolate are not appropriate. All children have access to water should they prefer this.

ASTHMA INHALERS

It is absolutely vital that children who require an asthma inhaler (or an epipen) have them in school. Inhalers should be clearly labelled with your child's name and class and should be handed in to class teachers and will be stored in classrooms for easy access. Epipens should be regularly renewed, clearly labelled and handed into the school office.
