Launch of the 'Year of the Word'- 'The God who Speaks'

This Advent sees the beginning of an important year in the Catholic Church of England and Wales: A Year of the Word. As the Church's focus turns to Year A, St. Matthew's Gospel, we are asked to consider the many ways in which God speaks to us: through the Bible, through Prayer and through other people. In partnership with the Bible Society, 'The God Who Speaks: The Year of the Word' focuses on celebrating, living and sharing God's word. The aim is to give children are greater understanding of Scripture,
