Learning Project Week 7

Theme - Celebrations

Weekly Maths tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Log on to <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> your child will have an individual login to access this
- Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.
- Use <u>Mathletics</u> and play some of the tasks you have been set. your child will have an individual login to access this.
- Use <u>Purple Mash</u> to practise your maths skills your child will have an individual login to access this.
- Adding totals of the weekly shopping list or some work around money. This game could support
 work on adding money.
- Practise telling the time. This could be done through this game (scroll down to access the game). Read to the guarter hour and the nearest 5 minutes.
- Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything they know about **Money**. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be.
- Practise counting forwards and backwards from any given number in 4s.

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Use <u>Purple Mash</u> to practise your reading and comprehension through the use of serial Mash
- You could share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day.
- Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.
- Watch <u>Newsround</u> and discuss what is happening in the wider world.
- Get your child to read a book on Oxford Owl, discuss what your child enjoyed about the book
- Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?
- With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers.

Weekly Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Practise the Year 3/4 common exception words (see below for list)
- Go to the Top Marks website and play some spelling/grammar games
- Use Readiwriter and practise the words you have been set. your child will have an individual login to access this.
- Choose 5 Common Exception words. Write synonyms, antonyms, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Can the word be modified?
- Choose 5 Common Exception words and practise spelling them using words within words.
 Write the word and find smaller words within them, e.g. spelling = line, gel, in, etc....

Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Write a postcard to a family member recounting a celebration that has just taken place.
- Write a set of instructions for 'How to play the new game?' Remember to include a list of things they will need. Also not forgetting to include headings and subheadings. Then write their set of instructions, remembering to include imperative verbs. (Verbs that command you to do something). Think about the key rules!
- Write a non-chronological report about a particular religious festival they have found out about.
- Write a scary story that would be great to read aloud on Halloween. Use the images on Spooky to give them some inspiration.
- Design a card celebrating a religious celebration, remember to include a poem/verse for inside. You could make either an Eid, Easter, Diwali card etc....

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Weekly R.E. (Aim to do 2/3 times a week)

• Visit <u>universalis</u>, on the left hand side select Readings from Mass. On the right hand side, find the readings for Sunday's Mass.

Reflective Tasks:

- Monday You need to read Sunday's Gospel.
- Tuesday Explain the Gospel to someone in your house (sibling, parents or carer)
- **Thursday** Log onto <u>daily reflections</u> select one of the readings and write a reflective piece about what we can learn from this reading.
- Friday Create a modern reading of the Gospel in your own words in your note book.

Learning project (To be done throughout the week)

This project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about celebrations. Learning may focus on different types of celebrations that take place and who may celebrate them. It could look at how people celebrate different events differently in other parts of the world.

Let's Wonder:

How are birthdays celebrated around the world? <u>India China America Africa</u> etc.. maybe there's a particular country they would like to find out about. Create fact files to show the similarities and differences between them.


Let's Create:
