This Sunday is the last in the Church's year. It is the day on which we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. This feast presents a golden opportunity for us to make a new start with Jesus – the Universal King. This week's Gospel reminds us that Jesus' kingship is not one of political power, crowns and splendour, but one of peace and truth. He is not an earthly king - his kingdom is heaven is as our leader. At Sacred Heart, we teach our children to be good leaders through the various responsibilities they are given. Encourage them at home too to think about what is it that makes good leaders.

A good leader is:

trustworthy, inspiring, supportive, a good role model - someone who is wise, truthful and uses their authority to help others.
