# **Waterbottles**

As previously mentioned, the school is not providing pupils with water bottles due to the concerns over the damage that plastic is causing our environment. Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school each day that they can refill and then take home to be washed.

#### **Uniform reminders**

Children should now be wearing their winter uniform. All pupils need to wear a white shirt and school tie and not polo shirts. It was wonderful to see how parents reflected their views on the importance of our school uniform during the parent questionnaire last year.
