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Attendance

We understand that children can be unwell from time to time which stops them from attending school. However, your child's good attendance at school is vital to ensure that they make as much progress as possible and achieve to the best of their ability. Absence disrupts the education of the individual pupil and the whole class. Those children who do not attend regularly:

- do not achieve well academically
- find it difficult to maintain friendships

Regular absence has a negative effect on children.

- > If your child is absent from school, parents **must** phone school **before 9.30am** to explain why.
- If no contact has been made by parents or guardians then school will phone the contact numbers provided.
- If no contact can be made, then a home visit may be carried out by school to find out the reasons for the child's absence.

These steps are to ensure the safety and welfare of the child.

Please ensure that school always has the most up to date contact details. Every parent should provide an emergency contact number for more than one person.

Attendance during one school year	equals this number of days absent	which is approximately this many weeks absent	which means this number of lessons missed
95%	9 days	2 weeks	50 lessons
90%	19 days	4 weeks	100 lessons
85%	29 days	6 weeks	150 lessons
80%	38 days	8 weeks	200 lessons

If your child's level of absence is of serious concern, the school will offer advice and support to improve attendance. After this, any unauthorised absence may result in the School and the Local Authority taking legal action.

If you have concerns about your child's school attendance or punctuality, please contact the school urgently. They may be able to assist you or even offer you an Early Help Assessment.

Again, we would like to thank those parents who make sure their children are attending school regularly and are therefore benefiting fully from their educational opportunity.
